

Safety Bundle Committee 2019 Progress

Patient Safety Bundles are a concept introduced by the Institute for Healthcare improvement, a bundle is a structured way of improving care processes and patient outcomes. Standardization of health care processes has been shown to improve outcomes and quality of care. The Council on Patient Safety in Women's Health Care disseminates patient safety bundles to help reduce variation and facilitate the standardization process. Safety Bundles are built on established best-practices and are designed to collate a critical set of processes based on the broad universe of existing guidance, tools and resources that have been developed by trusted organizations. The bundles are designed to be universally implementable and able to be consistently used across disciplines and settings.

The Utah Department of Health, in partnership with the Wyoming Department of Health, is hosting a meeting on March 5-6, 2020 to wrap-up the AIM Severe Hypertension in Pregnancy Bundle and Kick-off the Obstetric Care for Women with Opioid Use Disorder. The meeting will include a Hypertension simulation, Bias training and discussion of the Opioid Use Disorder bundle.
