<b>Post-Transfer Communication</b>								
How will the hospital provider report back to the OOH provider on the patient's hospital course?	The UWNQC form should include contact information for the OOH provider. Most often the OOH provider accompanies the patient. The receiving provider will call the patient's OOH provider if the patient signs a Release of Information.
