

Structures



Structures are the **context** in which care occurs.

They include things like infrastructure and staff.

Processes



Processes are the patient-provider **transactions**.

They include things like screenings and patient support.



Outcomes



Outcomes are the **effects** of care on patients.

They include things like c-sections or birth complications.





Structure measure collection plan

Share community resources with patients.
Educate patients on urgent warning signs .
Use validated screening tools.
Have a written assessment and response protocol.

Have an **inpatient-outpatient workgroup**.

URGENT MATERNAL WARNING SIGNS



Headache that won't go away or gets worse over time



Dizziness or fainting



Thoughts about hurting yourself or your baby



Changes in yourvision





Trouble breathing



Chest painor fast-beating heart



Severe belly pain that doesn't go away



Severe nausea and throwing up (not like morning sickness)



Baby's movements stopping or slowing



Vaginal bleeding or fluid leaking during pregnancy



Vaginal bleeding or fluid leaking after pregnancy





Structure measure collection plan

- Share <u>Maternal Resource Guide</u> with patients.
- ✓ Share AIM's <u>Urgent Warning Signs</u> infographic.
- Use validated screening tools.
- Have a written assessment and response protocol.
- Have an inpatient-outpatient workgroup.





Processes measure collection plan

- Receive provider mental health training.
- Receive provider respectful care education.
- **Educate patients** on mental health.





Processes measure collection plan

- Attend telehealth presentations.
- Patient mental health education
- Provider respectful care education





Outcome measure collection plan

Referrals and treatment for patients with a mental health diagnosis.





State surveillance measures

Number of deliveries per reporting period.
Number of patients with a mental health diagnosis.
Cases of severe maternal morbidity (SMM) among those
with a mental health diagnosis.
